Terms of Reference

Clinical Trainees Rheumatology Outcomes Research Funds

Details

• Funding is available to support undergraduate medical students or postgraduate medical education residents engaging in a research project with aims to improving outcomes or advancing knowledge relating to rheumatology outcomes research.

Funding

- Up to Five (5) awards are available annually
- The maximum amount awarded per project, per year is \$10,000

Eligibility

- Medical students enrolled in the undergraduate medical education program, or residents enrolled in a postgraduate medical education program at the Cumming School of Medicine, AND
- Engaging in research relevant to rheumatology (including but not limited to endocrinology, radiology, rheumatology, orthopedics, etc.)
- The research lab lead investigator is a McCaig Institute for Bone & Joint Health member and is eligible to hold funds at the University of Calgary.
- Letter of support from the research lab lead investigator.

Use of funds

- Operational research support, including but not limited to:
 - Project recruitment activities, including engagement with research partners, collaborators, and external organizations
 - \circ $\;$ Participant honoraria, partner stipends, other compensations, or reimbursements
 - Knowledge dissemination activities, including presentation or publication of work
 - Travel, accommodation, food, and incidentals as per the University of Calgary Travel & Expense handbook.
 - Purchase of materials or supplies needed to conduct the research activities.
 - Purchase of data management or data analysis software to support the research.
- The term of support is 12 months (1 year) with potential to extend the term for one additional year (with no additional funds).
- Upon completion of the research project, all unused funds will be returned to the Arthur J.E. Child Chair account

 Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis, until the budget is expended for the fiscal year

Accountability

• Acknowledgement of funding received from the Arthur J.E. Child Chair in Rheumatology Research in associated presentations, publications, or knowledge mobilization activities.



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- The recipient shall provide detailed receipts or copies of invoices for any items requiring reimbursement or purchased directly through the AJE Child Chair research office.
- Sharing of the results and impact of project with McCaig Institute and trainees upon completion. (ie/ McCaig seminar series, or AJE Child Chair trainee session).
